I sat down with Simon McCormick and his mom, Karen on a hot afternoon in August. Simon, seated at a picnic table with the requisite basketball perched in front of him, smiled from ear to ear, one of the most engaging and genuine smiles I've ever seen. And it's not just his smile that makes Simon McCormick special.

Now a senior at Cony High School, I asked Simon what it was like growing up in Whitefield. He told me it was great, he knew everyone, and had lots of good friends. From the age of three, he always loved and played sports. Beginning in 7th grade he played AAU basketball, travelling many miles for tournaments and grueling practice schedules. This was just the beginning. Karen laughs at this point reminding him how many thousands of miles her little car has travelled over the years.

Going to Cony from Whitefield wasn't much of an adjustment for Simon, he simply did what he has always done, engage friends, play sports and work hard academically. At Cony he plays three sports; basketball, soccer and track. He's not just a great athlete. He is also a scholar, having been inducted into the National Honor Society in his junior year. And there's more, he can sing and act too, participating in Chizzle Wizzle (Cony's annual entertainment event) each year. In his spare time he helps run basketball clinics for kids and assists with a Special Olympics team. Simon now has his license, much to Karen's delight, but Karen travels to every game, every tournament.

On July 16, Simon's Portland-based team, the Blue Wave, won the Amateur Athletic Union 17U national championship in Orlando, Florida.

Simon, a stand out point guard, scored the Blue Wave's tying basket in the second overtime with a layup on a set play. In the 3rd overtime, teammate Logan Bagshaw, of Greely, made all 3 foul shots to win the game.

I asked Simon about future plans. He said he wants to go to Colby, Bates or Bowdoin, but Colby is his first choice. He's interested in business, psychology and sociology. Simon told me he's a people person and although he plans to see other places after college, he said he is a homebody at heart.

I asked Simon what is most important to him. He smiled that million dollar smile and said, "Friendship, family, coming together and winning!" Whitefield is very proud of this young man.

At mainething.com/amish, Whitefield's David Chase, a former art teacher who has become deeply involved with the local Amish community, offers his newest version of his detailed downloadable map of the area's growing Amish community, including families living in Windsor and Jefferson and those soon to arrive.

Names of the families as well as what type of services they offer are included. For instance, one learns that Ben and Annie Zook live at 544 Cooper Road in Whitefield and offer custom-made canvas products, baked goods, and dairy products, and that John and Melinda Miller live at 25 Mills Road and make wreaths and quilts and do woodwork.

"The map was created with the help of the Amish with the understanding that it would be updated every year to reflect their growing community and products and service," David said. He said is getting tens of thousands of "hits" online.

David has long had a soft spot for the Amish, since they began arriving in Whitefield in early 2017. "They are people who are very different from us (longtime locals). When they came, I thought, 'It might not be a good landing.' I wanted to soften their landing," David told me.

He has tried to help "soften their landing" in Whitefield by offering a wealth of information about the Amish at his website, mainething.com, including videos of the Amish at work, such as the interesting "Ice Harvest 2018."

"We need diversity," David said passionately of the influx of Amish from New York, Kentucky, and Michigan. "I have met every single one of them. I did that in a week."

He continues to meet new Amish families as they arrive in town.


David is a big believer in getting to know the people in one's community, no matter how "different" they might seem at first glance. And he is quick to say that if anyone talks badly about any

of our Amish neighbors, "I ask if they have met them and talked to them

"We can count on the Amish to give us lessons," he said, comparing the peaceful, hardworking Amish to Buddhists. "We can't see them as 'from away' or 'intrusive.' They are here to help."



Whitefield Historical Society "Just Yesterday"



"Street View North Whitefield Maine" postcard stamped June 1, 1911, mailed to Mr. Phillips in Boston. This postcard was published for F.W. Douglas. The Hodgkins store was owned by a Mrs. Hodgkin who sold dry goods. Prior to that it had been owned by John Tarr. There was a small hall over the store that was used for meetings, dances, and to show "moving pictures". How appropriate that after being purchased at Douglas Store in Whitefield, it comes back here to live! (Postcard purchased online by Libby for WHS)

Correction:

In the last newsletter, the "Just Yesterday" piece mis-placed the Douglas Store.

It reported that the store was "beside" Arlington Grange and indeed the grange hall could be seen next to the store in the photo. - not! Since the late 19th century, and like today there have been 5 buildings between the grange hall and what is now the Superette. Douglas store was the middle of the 5 buildings.

On the right of the store was the home of Calvin Flanders and next on the right was the home of Percy Cunningham (also the telephone office) and to the right of his home is Arlington Grange now our Library. April 10, 1948 Percy was burning rubbish and the fire ignited the grass that spread to both Calvin's home and Douglas's store - both were destroyed.

Later Chet Chase brought the land where these buildings had stood and he built the two "new" homes that stand today between Percy's and the Bailey's. - a long ways from our Grange/Library building... Thanks
